I have learned over the years that you cannot trust everything you receive over the internet, so the cynic in me checked around and learned that the email was a hoax. There was no girl dying of cancer for which the American Cancer Society would pay three cents per email that was forwarded in her honor. So, why am I thankful for this one piece of hoax email--hoax email that slows file servers, wastes time, fills inboxes to the limit, enables identity theft, and preys upon the kindnesses of readers?


After I shared that the email was a hoax, no matter how touching its message, Mrs. Kathy Link and I exchanged several emails. As we "chatted," she pointed out another way the poem was false. Mrs. Kathy mentioned that music never stops, rather it becomes more holy as angels and heavenly host sing, "Hosanna to the Lord." How I loved to read that insight! It is true that we face illness, depression, pain, heartache, and despair in this life. Music may be the worst thing or the last thing, we long for during those moments. Then again, music might be balm for the wounded spirit. No matter how we regard music, we constantly are given the possibility to experience the gift of music in this life and in the next.

Mrs. Kathy went on to point out that the God who created music, dance, and singing also gave us meditation and quiet. In the still and quiet place, music plays on. How can this be? Think about music. Music contains notes and rests. If not, the music would be mere noise instead of song. Our lives also contain silence and speech, motion and rest. When we block out the noise of our busy lives and pause to listen for God's still, small voice, our spirits can be restored. During those quiet moments with God, the Lord's almighty, majestic, and musical presence can fill our hearts with love, grace, and peace.

I am thankful that this fall an email led to a conversation that re-opened my eyes to God's gracious gift of music. Perhaps this column has had a similar effect upon you. I hope so, and I hope that during this holiday season we can join together and give thanks for the gift of music that God created to last now and forevermore.
