


In a few weeks we'll have our congregational meeting where we vote on the church budget. Just as with any organization, the church has expenses and receives money to pay those expenses. We have money for our church to function because of our church offering. We give our offering to honor and glorify God. We give to say "thank you" for all that God has graced our lives with.

Money that the church receives goes to St. Paul operating expenses, to salary for its employees, and to the South Carolina Synod among other places. Some helps support Newberry College and other Lutheran institutions of learning such as Southern Seminary. There is funding for Lutheran World Relief and for the Lutheran World Hunger Organization (that provides services more efficiently than the Red Cross). So, there is global reach to the money we place in the offering plate.

Recently I thought of something else I wanted to share with you. It's something I'd never realized before—that when we give money to the church, we really are giving to one another. Pennies spent on cotton balls and paper plates for LCY skit props in 2004 helped nurture two of our young men's' faith that years later carry them across the world to do mission work. Dollars directed toward the social ministry committee may be the reason your family member who is shut in has a new visitor this year. Dollars spent on Sunday school music materials are teaching our children Bible songs they will remember for a lifetime. There are so many more ways our shared gifts, in this case our shared monetary gifts, are used to minister to others. As we budget our money (I have a part time job now so this applies to me, too!) and as we prepare for the upcoming congregational meeting, let's keep in mind how when we give money to the church we are giving to one another. The church, after all, is the people.





School of Religion

Each session of the School of Religion will be held at Grace Lutheran Church, Prosperity, SC, on Tuesdays, January 4, 11, 18, and 25, 2011. The sessions will be held from 7 to 9 p.m. with a break for refreshments and fellowship.

What is the School of Religion?

The cost of the school will be funded from individual registration fees, congregational contributions, and Thrivent Financial for Lutherans. Other donations are also welcomed.


