This year in the Thanksgiving Eve service Pastor Nichols raised a question that got me thinking. What if the only things you had today were the things you remembered to thank God for yesterday? For me, one important part is taking time to smell the roses and give not just myself credit but God credit for all the progress that has happened. Instead I find myself worrying about all the changes that will be coming up in life as I look for jobs now and start thinking about living on my own. The anxiety and emotional struggles that go along with that transition have made it really hard sometimes to be thankful or to even realize just how better things have been the past few months than they have been for years.

It fact, it's been a daily grind. There have been lots of times where putting a smile on my face for Thomas has been really hard work and a forced smile at that. It has been hard to put one foot in front of the other and show up to do journalism work but I have kept going. In a big way it is progress because my body is not shutting down anymore, so I can keep it going. Even so, the bulk of the time since I've been back from Mayo in September I've been just going through the motions with the choir and with the children's music. I know I love those children and I love guitar and music. I know I love the church and being a part of it all. I know how I was raised and how important it always has been for me, so I keep coming and keep doing it whether I feel the joy and experience the close feelings with God or not. I know he is faithful and that these emotional issues are way smaller than God is. Though sometimes my perspective really gets out of whack and it becomes hard to keep that in mind.

So, I keep going and doing. At times the depression breaks and the happiness returns and that is encouraging. The day I was at Mayo for a follow up visit in October, they assured me that this is part of the healing process. One thing that came out of my time at Mayo is that I'm really not supposed to talk about all the symptoms, emotional or otherwise, very much. That change has been a real struggle. In fact, many of you used to get email updates detailing those very things, but that change has been a positive one and one that will lead to greater wholeness long term.

I debated even writing this Chattin' with Kevin about the emotional ups and downs at all. But other people maybe are wrestling with something similar for different reasons as the holidays draw near and I thought that if some way this could help, then it would be worth it. Talking about it in an article like this is okay, but if I focus on it or if it becomes a main conversation I have with folks over the course, then that makes it harder to heal. So, if you



ask and I tell you that things are okay or good enough or getting there and I don't elaborate much, please don't feel as if I am shutting you off. I'm just trying to keep doing the things they taught me to do at Mayo to keep any medical disruptions as small as they possibly can be.

I hope that medical advice makes sense from a practical standpoint, but the reason I brought this whole thing up at all is spiritual. This fall I've continued to do all those church activities not necessarily because of how it makes me feel or what I get out of it or am I doing them for God first and foremost. At least that's my hope and prayer:

- To still remain faithful in God's promises.
- To remain thankful and hopeful.
- To continue learning and growing and knowing that the Lord is big enough to use the hard parts in our lives to bring in great goodness.

That gift of devotedness that comes from years of habits of coming to church and doing things for God is helping carry me through a time in life that I really didn't see coming and is hard to understand, quite frankly. I have heard from other folks over the years with similar stories and thinking of them has helped me to keep going and keep doing and help me grow. Thank you for whatever role you've played over the years to help nurture those tendencies and that spiritual growth as we walk in Christ together. That impact is one important gift God gives us through his church and certainly something to be thankful for today as we remember his promises this Advent season.

Old Business:


• Dana Werts brought two file cabinets for the secretary's office.

Provide Assistance to the People of our Companion Synods:

- Nurture friendship through visits and provide assistance when needed to our companion synods in Tanzania, Japan, and Colombia.
 - o Wired \$19,000 needed for a pipe line so that in the midst of a severe drought, people in the SW Diocese in Tanzania could have water.
 - o Wired \$83,000 to our companion synod in Japan (JELC) to help them during the devastation caused by the Pacific earthquake and tsunami.
 - Wired \$5,000 to Colombia, South America so that children could have a better school

Provide Assistance to the People of South Carolina:

Help prepare 38 men and women who are called to be pastors and other rostered leaders by having a ministry team that gathers at the Synod office to be sure these candidates for ministry are following the path in seminary and are engaged in experiences that will enable them to become successful leaders.

Work together and pool our resources so that, with God's help, we can support five mission congregations.

Work with congregations that need to be revitalized.

- Assist pastors and congregational leaders when they need assistance.
 - o Provide supply pastors as needed;
 - o Work with congregations searching for a new pastor;
 - o Provide assistance to local congregations when they need assistance with budget planning, stewardship, and evangelism.
 - o Assist pastors and lay leaders with videos, books, or curriculum from the Synod's Resource Center to enhance their Christian Education programs.
- Provide positive experiences for youth and young adults:
 - o Provide youth ministry events for youth and adults with the goal of helping young people understand God's love and purpose for their lives.

- o Provide leadership development through the Synod Lutheran Church Youth organization for young leaders and a Spirit-led community for fulfilling God's mission.
- o Provide and help to support 11 campus ministry sites to welcome our young adults when they go to college.
- Send support checks each month to the following:
 - o Lutheran Homes of SC
 - o Lutheran Family Services in the Carolinas
 - o Lutheridge+Lutherock Ministries, Inc.
 - Newberry College
 - o SC Lutheran Conference and Retreat Centers
 - o Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary
