In 2011 I learned that looking for a full time job is a hard thing to do, but along the way I found an unexpected reminder I wanted to share with you. I was at the SC Works office in Newberry last December when I met a job development coach from Laurens County named Joy. We started talking after a workshop I had attended and chatted for around 45 minutes. Joy had worked at DSS for years before taking her current position. As I shared my resume with her and she promised to send in on to some of her old contacts. Now networking is part of the job search game, so I was glad to have met her. Things might have ended there, but as she read over my resume her eyes lit up when she found out that I wrote for children.

I had something on my resume about public speaking and before I knew it I found my-self telling her my story. She also had overcome a traumatic event in her formative years, something she drew upon as she worked for a nonprofit agency. We had a lot in common and that led her to think I might be able to do that kind of work for a nonprofit organization.

Later that day I emailed her a copy of my resume and here is part of her reply to me. It is something to think about. "Your presence, not to mention your experience, parallels the characteristics that would be paramount in someone working in a non-profit field. I truly see you doing that! Maybe even through some type of Christian-based affiliation, too. The sky is TRULY the limit for you! Don't put limitations on your life....your circumstance...your health.....remember, "God's delay is NEVER His denial!" This is your year! Just know that, DECREE THAT into existence...SPEAK IT, BELIEVE IT and RECEIVE IT! Thank you, thank you so much for inspiring me again, on last week. It amazes me how God strategically places people in our pathways that make such an impression on our day, on our lives. Thank you for being that willing vessel to demonstrate the presence and love of God towards me, on last Thursday. My life is more blessed, just by our encounter."

All I set out to do that day was pass out a resume but there was something bigger at work. I thanked her for her kind words and asked if I could share them with you in the



newsletter. I have made arrangements for her to get some copies of the Little Christian to use with foster children she interacts with whenever it is appropriate to do so. No job lead may come from that contact but maybe a child will read the Little Christian who otherwise would not have. Maybe his or her faith will blossom from that and who knows what good will come from it in the future? That kind of thoughts help build a person up and I really needed to be pointed back to those kind of thoughts instead of obsessing over what might or might not happen.

Can you think of times in life where God may have delayed something coming your way and you just could not understand why or what was going on? In hindsight we can see the wisdom in what happened sometimes, but for some reason our humanity keeps us from understanding as things are going on. God made us that way. It is hard to figure out the way things must happen in God's time. That idea of God's time was in Pastor Nichols sermon a few weeks ago and the notion of God's time has come up in Chattin' with Kevin's before, too.

On that day at the SC Works office, Joy and encouragement helped me get some needed perspective and provided a reminder of who is in control of all things. It was a reminder I wasn't looking for but that I so needed to receive. It wasn't just me sharing my faith and story with her but she took a real chance and opportunity to share her powerful story with me. For a brief moment I found Joy, real joy and relief from the job hunting stress and worry about the future I had placed upon myself. A week or so later when I had a job interview I repeated what Joy told me and it helped me get through the process. I didn't get the job but that is how it goes sometimes. I'll keep looking until the right opportunity comes along. Joy helped that day and in the week afterwards. Ironically, the stress piled up again today as I am writing this column, so maybe the topic that I chose to write about a few weeks ago has come back around to remind me at right time once more: God's delay (for something to happen) is never his denial.

Minutes were read and approved for the December meeting.

Mrs. Carolyn Torrence made a presentation to the council about the South Carolina Synod campaign, "Growing in God's Mission." This is a 3 – 5 year campaign by the South Carolina Synod. It has these specific goals: 1. Deepening Discipleship 2. Planting and Sustaining Mission Congregations 3. Equipping congregations to engage in their communities 4. Discipleship Training for Rostered Leaders: the Next Generation 5. Increasing Educational Opportunities for the People for the South West Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania She asked that a leader be appointed from the congregation and that person will be trained. This is over and beyond the budget.

Treasurer's Report:

The information was shared from the Treasurer's report.

Committee Reports:

Cemetery Committee: John Wheeler presented the cemetery report.

Social Ministry Committee: The committee has the directory to proof. They are completing the Angel Tree drive. The food from the food drive was taken to St. James A.M.E. church. Property Committee: They replaced the flood light and will address the gutter system. A discussion was held on how to address issues with the basement after the flooding.

Old Business:

The council will call a congregational meeting related to changing the number of council members from 16 to 12.

A motion was made and passed to send \$500 to Manantial de Vida (Spring of Life) 7900 Nell Street. Columbia, South Carolina 29223-6226 from South Carolina Mission support. The December 25th service will be at 10:00 a.m. on Christmas Day. There will be no Sunday School on this day.

Pastor Nichols will present Debbie Werts a remembrance for her work on the anniversary committee.


Barry Werts has a tractor he would be willing to donate to the church with the understanding if the church wants to get rid of it will be returned to him.


Jackie Perry asked that her Thrivent Choice funds be designated for the LCY.
